Quizmaster - instructions: "This is round 2 of Euroquiz 2018, which consists of 10 spoken language questions. These questions have been devised in conjunction with Education Scotland and with SCILT (Scotland's National Centre for Languages) and have been recorded by native speakers at Heriot-Watt University, Edinburgh."

"For the first five questions, I will ask each question. You will then hear some information in German, Italian, Spanish and French which will contain the answer to each question. You will hear the recording twice. After the second time, you will be given a few moments to discuss the answer with your team. Write down the answer to the question **in English** on your sheet. You may make notes at any time, but it is **extremely important** that you remain completely silent while you are listening to the voices."

Question 1: What **time** is it?

RECORDING:

German: Es ist elf Uhr.

Italian: Sono le undici.

Spanish: Son las once.

French: Il est onze heures.

ANSWER: It is 11.00 / 11 o'clock.

Question 2: What **colour** is the pencil case?

RECORDING:

German: Das Etui ist rosa.

Italian: L'astuccio e' rosa.

Spanish: El estuche es rosa.

French: La trousse est rose.

ANSWER: The pencil case is **pink**.

Question 3: **When** does Jess play tennis?

RECORDING:

German: Jess spielt donnerstags Tennis.

Italian: Jess gioca a tennis le giovedi.

Spanish: Jess juega al tenis los jueves.

French: Jess joue au tennis le jeudi.

ANSWER: Jess plays tennis on **Thursdays**.

Question 4: **What** does Eva order at the cafe?

RECORDING:

German: Ich möchte bitte ein Stück Kuchen.

Italian: Vorrei una torta per favore.

Spanish: Me gustaría un pastel, por favor.

French: Je voudrais un gâteau, s'il vous plaît.

ANSWER: I would like a **cake/piece of cake** please.

Question 5: Listen to the weather report. **What is the weather like today?**

RECORDING:

German: Heute ist es kalt.

Italian: Fa freddo oggi.

Spanish: Hoy, hace frío.

French: Aujourd'hui, il fait froid.

ANSWER: Today it is **cold.**

Quizmaster: "You will now hear 5 phrases in German, Spanish, Italian and French. Write down what you think each one means in English on your sheet. You may make notes at any time, but it is **extremely important** that you remain completely silent while you are listening to the voices."

Question 6: What does this mean in English?

RECORDING:

German: Bitte sprechen Sie langsamer.

Italian: Per favore, parla più lentamente.

Spanish: Hable más despacio por favor.

French: Parlez plus lentement, s'il vous plaît.

ANSWER: **Please speak more slowly.**

Question 7: What does this mean in English?

RECORDING:

German: Ich wohne in Frankreich.

Italian: Vivo in Francia.

Spanish: Vivo en Francia.

French: J'habite en France.

ANSWER: **I live in France.**

Question 8: What does this mean in English?

RECORDING:

German: Mein Bruder heißt Alex.

Italian: Il mio fratello si chiama Alex.

Spanish: Mi hermano se llama Alex.

French: Mon frère s'appelle Alex.

ANSWER: **My brother is called Alex / My brother's name is Alex.**

Question 9: What does this mean in English?

RECORDING:

German: Herzlichen Glückwunsch zum Geburtstag!

Italian: Buon Compleanno!

Spanish: ¡Feliz cumpleaños!

French: Joyeux anniversaire!

ANSWER: **Happy birthday!**

Question 10: What does this mean in English?

RECORDING:

German: Ich mag keinen Käse.

Italian: Non mi piace il formaggio.

Spanish: No me gusta el queso.

French: Je n'aime pas le fromage.

ANSWER: **I don't like cheese**




